

GUIDELINES FOR PREPARATION OF ABSTRACTS FOR FREE PAPERS

Abstract format

Abstracts of free papers should not exceed 300 words of text. Abstracts should be typed double spaced. State the title in capital letters. On a new line, state the names of all the authors and the address of the institutions where the research was done. **Do not** use prefixes such as Dr., Prof., Mr., Ms., etc. **Do not** include qualifications here. The body of the text should be typed in Times New Roman (font size 12). Use Arabic numerals and SI units throughout. The abstract should describe original work, and indicate the purpose of the study, methods and materials used, statistical methods employed, and results obtained. Statements such as “conclusions will be discussed at the session” are unacceptable.

References when given should not exceed 5 in number. This should be indicated in the text only by a superscript number (eg. The renal acid secreting capacity has been estimated hitherto by ¹...) at the end of the abstract in the text and should follow in the pattern indicated below.

Abstracts should be sent via e-mail to the Secretary, Physiological Society of Sri Lanka (physiologicalsocietyofsl@gmail.com) on or before **15th of September 2021**. The consent needs to be sent by filling the google form by **all the authors**.

Referencing guide

Standard Journal Article.

All authors when six or less should be listed ; when seven or more the first three should be listed and should be followed by et al. Please note that in the case of journal articles, the names and initials of author(s) should be followed by the full title, the name of the journal in full, year, volume and first and last page numbers of the article.

Eg: Maxwell C A, Kelly K A, Wilson S, et al. Young age as a prognostic factor in cervical cancer : analysis of population based data from 10022 bases. British Medical Journal 1988; 296:386-391.

Corporate author.

WHO Task force on the use of prostaglandins for the regulation of fertility.

Contraception 1977;16:175-182.

No author given.

Anonymous. British Counts (Editorials). Lancet 1984; 1448-1449.

Books and monographs.

Editor as author.

Krauer B, Krauer F, Hytten F, eds. Drug prescribing in pregnancy. London: Churchill Livingstone, 1984; 19-83.

Personal author(s).

Fox H, Langley F. A, Tumors of Ovary. London: William Heinemann, 1976 ;153.

Chapter in a book.

Schilsky R L, Clinical Pharmacology of Methotrexate. In Ames MM, Powis G , Korach J S, eds.

Published proceedings paper.

Goodall D, Labb M C, The use of classical caesarean section for the very low birth weight infant. In: Roy Chowdhury NN, ed. Proceedings of the third Asian-Oceania congress of perinatology. Calcutta: Indian society of perinatology and reproductive biology 1983;284-287.

Presentation of papers.

The oral presentation of each paper at the sessions should not exceed 10 minutes. A discussion not exceeding 5 minutes will follow each presentation. Facilities will be available for multimedia projection. If a presenter is using multimedia projection the presentation should be transferred to computer before the beginning of the free paper session.

Rejected manuscripts.

Papers not conforming to the requirements of the society may be rejected or returned for compliance. Rejected manuscripts will not be returned.

Correspondence.

Forward the abstracts of free papers with the google forms filled by all authors confirming their consent, to the Secretary, PSSSL on or before **15th September 2021**.
